

Academia and industry increasingly act on a global scale. How nice, if this brings together the knowledge and competencies of people of different background and facilitates synergies. But intercultural communication leads often to typical misunderstandings or even conflicts which could be avoided.

Therefore intercultural competence forms an important key qualification. It strengthens the awareness of cultural differences and helps to reflect or, if necessary, to correct one's own perceptions and patterns of action. Intercultural differences can thus be bridged and a basis for an improved collaboration develops.

ACADEMIC WRITING AND PUBLISHING

TUESDAY, 26.09., at 9:00

For many scientists writing and publishing is the most difficult part of research work. Poor structure, breakneck formulations and unclear argumentation lead to texts which are not too user friendly. However, for the success of academics it is essential that the content is successfully conveyed to the relevant target groups – from the subject community to the wider public.

In this workshop the process of academic writing and publishing is highlighted from the first idea through the structuring and formation of the text to its completion and publication. The participants engage with the content related, formal and organisational aspects of writing and train their text competency with exercises.



SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS (& DOCTORAL CANDIDATES)

TUESDAY, 26.09., at 9:00

The supervision of bachelor students, master students (and PhD candidates) is a challenge, an opportunity and a privilege all at once. But how to ensure productive supervision?

In this workshop, participants deal with their individual circumstances of supervision and advice. Through exercises they will familiarize themselves with established techniques for supervising students and doctoral candidates and train their skills of communication with regard to good and co-operative supervision and advice. The workshop contents in detail are as follows:

HOW TO START YOUR OWN GROUP GRANT MANAGEMENT

TUESDAY & WEDNESDAY, 26. & 27.09., at 9:00

A successful scientific career is what you are dreaming of? Then this workshop is the right choice for you.

Scientists need to develop advanced tools and skills to lead international teams and manage scientific projects. Important factors in performance are professional strategies, management, leadership, supervision and communication and conflict management.

A balanced and structured program of interactive lectures, challenging activities outside of the "comfort zone" and review sessions will provide a variety of first-hand learning situations allowing participants to identify and take away relevant lessons.





STARTING YOUR PhD

WEDNESDAY, 27.09., at 9:00

During the initial phase of their doctoral studies, participants will learn in this one-day workshop strategies for their personal productivity in challenging work contexts. The focus is on self-reliant conscious self-organization and self-motivation within the framework of their doctoral process.

Aspects of an individually designed work-life balance will also be discussed in the workshop, as they are important for the sustainable personal productivity and resilience of the doctoral candidates are significant.

For productive self-direction in one's own research work, it is also important to have an interesting professional goal vision that motivates a motivate them in their daily work; therefore, all participants should reflect on their professional

Nobody likes scientific presentations where the slides or the poster have too much text, three different fonts, small plots with poor contrast and no legend... and yet we still see them so often at conferences.

But how to prepare your slides to make an impression? How to prepare an award-winning poster? The graphical side of scientific presentation is an important, yet underrated topic.

This workshop will offer some tips and tricks to improve your slides and posters to help you with getting your ideas across to the scientific community.



BIAS AWARENESS: STRATEGIES TO CHANGE THOUGHT PATTERNS

It has been shown that a diverse research group supports the creativity and innovation in the science they do. Germany takes a lot of initiative to increase the diversity, so it might seem that the problem is solved. But if you ask people from the minority groups they probably don't think so.

We are all influenced by our culture, background and experience. We are all biased to think that where we come from is the "normal". That is normal. However, it would be a pity to limit our potential in scientific endeavors because of that. The way to go is to be aware that this is happening - learn to be aware of your own bias, to avoid falling into the same old patterns, to be a part of a welcoming environment.

PATENTS: WHAT, HOW AND WHAT FOR? DISCUSSION

WEDNESDAY, 27.09., at 19:00

Our speaker will introduce the notion of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs), such as patents, in the context of working in research institutions and companies.

One of the main challenges is to raise awareness of the usefulness of patents. The presentation will provide insights in what are the foundations of a patent, what a patent stands for and how to use it.

Another purpose of this presentation is to show how to benefit of integrating patent writing into the research process, by dealing with publishing your research in parallel to writing a patent application, or at least to establish synergies between these two processes. The presentation will be followed by an open discussion with the audience.

The propose of this workshop will be to inform the audience about the usefulness of patents, how to enter in this "complicated" and unusual matter, and how to benefit individually, but also as an organization or a company of including

patents, patent writing and patent applications in your workflow.

BARCAMP

THURSDAY, 28.09., 09:00 - 13:00

When skilled people come together, they find good topics to discuss on a high level very easily. That's the idea of a "BarCamp" - a format in which topics can be discussed without the narrow frame or static setting of a panel discussion or workshop.
